

Repatriates Ship Brings Fr. Cleary, Maryknoll Missioner

Rev. Patrick H. Cleary, M. S., formerly of Ithaca, and brother of Mrs. J. Emmet O'Brien, 92 San Gabriel Drive, and Mr. John P. Cleary, 783 Arnett Blvd. was one of the Maryknoll Missioners from Korea aboard the S.S. Gripsholm, which docked in New York Tuesday. This is the first of the exchange ships arriving in this country with passenger repatriated from the Japanese Empire.

The exchange of war prisoners took place at Lourenco Marques, Portuguese East Africa. The Gripsholm stopped at Rio de Janeiro for 48 hours before proceeding to New York.

LONDON — Francis E. Hull who started serving Mass when he was 8, has died here at the age of 80 and was still serving Mass within a few weeks of his death. He had served Mass in the church at Hampstead, London suburb, for 72 years.

return, Bishop James E. Walsh, Superior General of Maryknoll, made the following statement:

"Of the 400 Maryknoll priests, Brothers and Sisters in the Pacific was sent at the outbreak of hostilities, some twenty-five per cent were in the Japanese Empire. Most Maryknollers are still at their posts, a very substantial part of them in South China. A portion of those of Japan, Korea and Manchuria and a small group from Hong Kong have arrived on the Gripsholm."

"Our missioners in Japan have consistently taken the stand that they were to stay at their posts regardless of circumstances. While the American Ambassador on several occasions very graciously advised evacuation, the group has always replied that Catholic mission tradition required them to remain."

"The majority of these Maryknoll priests, Brothers and Sisters who have been repatriated from the Japanese Empire have each spent years in affectionate devotion to their people. A meager force of native clergy and European priests remain behind to care for the orphaned Christians during the period of the Maryknollers' enforced absence. Meantime, a substantial number of the returned missioners are answering the urgent calls to Maryknoll from Latin America."

Fr. White, Maryknoll Missioner Returns

GENEVA — Among the 1,451 Americans and other nationals arriving in New York on Tuesday aboard the Swedish diplomatic exchange ship Gripsholm, was Rev. R. Felix White of the Maryknoll Mission at Chuwa, Korea. He is the son of Mrs. Joseph W. White of 477 South Main Street.

Mrs. White received a communication from her son dated August 11th, at Rio de Janeiro, stating that he was to sail the following day. A number of missioners including priests and nuns are included in the list of exchange prisoners.

According to information from the Maryknoll Mission headquarters at Ossining, the Missioners will go directly to the headquarters of the order after disembarking. Later they will be permitted to return to their homes for a few months before re-assignment to other missions.

John F. Walsh Rites Held

GENEVA — The funeral of John F. Walsh, of 66 Jefferson Avenue, well-known local business man, who died on Thursday, August 20, at Strong Memorial Hospital in Rochester, was held on Monday morning at 9 o'clock at St. Stephen's Church.

Mr. Walsh was a life long resident of Geneva and a member of St. Stephen's parish. Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Mary Walsh; his son, John Walsh, Jr., a student at St. Bernard's Seminary in Rochester; and a daughter, Miss Mary Frances Walsh of Geneva; three brothers, Michael Walsh of Geneva; Thomas Walsh of Seneca Falls and James Walsh of Elmira.

Solemn requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. Edward Shamon. Rev. Thomas Kane was deacon and Rev. John Murphy sub-deacon. Master of ceremonies was Edward McAniff and second master of ceremonies was Richard Hanley.

Acolytes were Joseph Lynch and John Widman. The thurifer was Joseph Koonan. They were seminarians from St. Bernard's Seminary in Rochester.

In the sanctuary were: Rev. William H. McPadden, Rev. Dr. Elmer McNamara, Rev. John Leary and Rev. Raymond Nolan. Burial was in St. Patrick's Cemetery.
