

NAZIS CLOSE ALL BUT THREE CHURCHES IN METZ

LONDON Special measures of oppression have been taken against the Church by Nazi occupation authorities in the Alsace-Lorraine area, it is reported by the Polish Catholic press agency KAP. Under a new decree published

in Strasbourg, it is stated all festivities and ceremonies of a religious character are forbidden except the celebration of Holy Mass in the few churches allowed by the Nazis to remain open.

For any other kind of religious ceremony a special permission of the authorities of occupation is required. Such permission, according to the report is rarely given and an exorbitant fee must be paid. In Metz all religious schools and all

Reg Kehoe and His 'Marimba Queens' At Roseland Park

Reg Kehoe had several years of theatre headlining to his credit early in his musical career as a soloist. With the decline of vaudeville featured marimba and accordion soloist. With the decline of vaudeville Reg packed his instruments and returned to Lancaster, Pa., where he opened music studios. His success as a teacher and showman is ably demonstrated by his own Marimba Band, which he will present as a featured attraction at Roseland Park Canandaigua Lake, from August 31 to September 6, inclusive.

Nearly half of the girls who will appear here are charter members of the group. The success of the band is largely due to its originality because it is the only girl marimba group in the country. The marimba incidentally is an advanced form of the xylophone using calabash gourds as resonators. It is through these that the instruments get their resonant and full tones, totally different from that of any other musical instrument.

The only other male member of the band is Frank DiNunzio, called by Paul Whiteman, the hottest bass fiddler in show business. DiNunzio has developed an unusual stunt in being able to play the bass fiddle with the fingers of both hands simultaneously. He also has a natural aptitude for comedy which he sprinkles throughout his solos.

During part of their performance the girls switch musical instruments and perform on accordions. Their versatility, seemingly, is unlimited for they have been taught acrobatic and dance routines a combination which makes their presentation probably unequalled by any other group when it comes to variety.

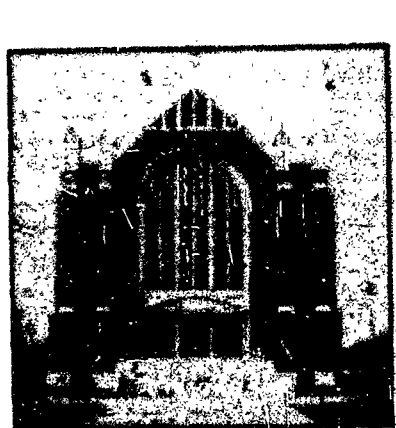

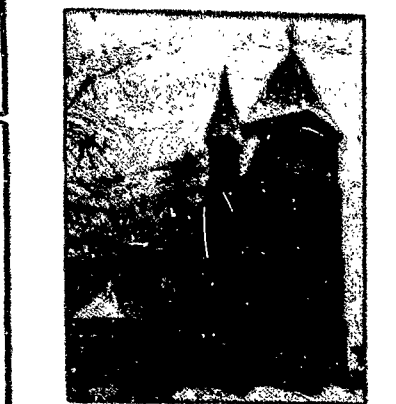
