

N.Y. Notre Dame Men Fete Entering Class

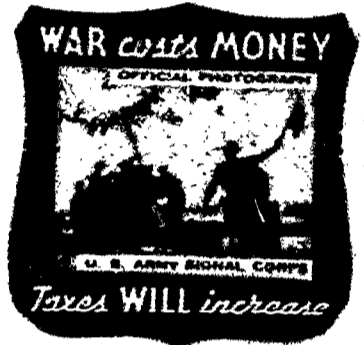

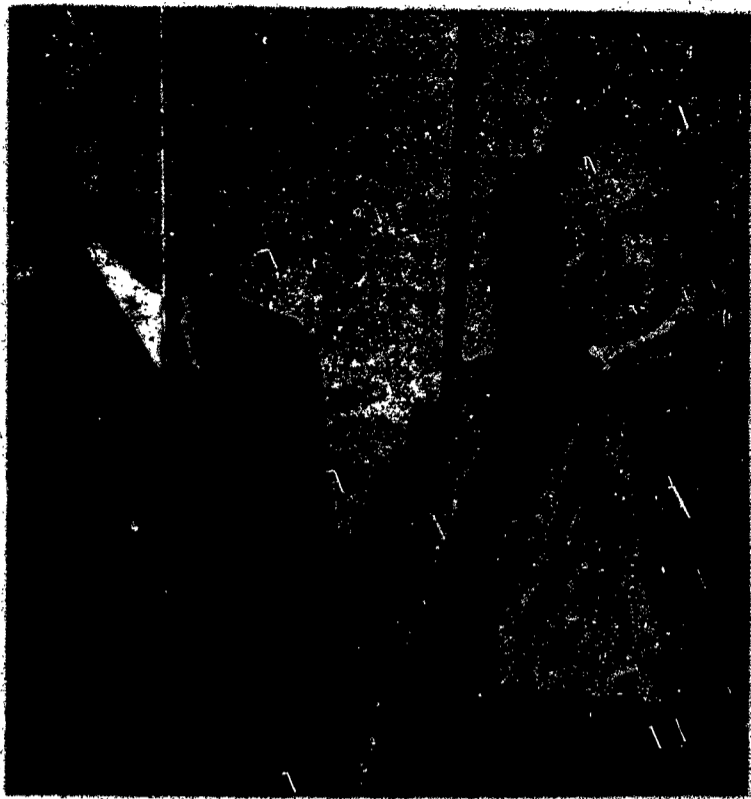

Theological Reviews Revived In Spain

MADRID.—The National Congress of Biblical Study and Theology, held at Zaragoza and Madrid, have proved to be points of departure for a general movement of research and study worthy of the older school of Spanish theology. Former reviews such as *Anales Sacrae Theologiae* and *Estudios Teologicos* have been revived and two new publications devoted to theological subjects have come to light.

Archive *Teologice Granadinae* is published by the Pontifical Faculty of Theology at Granada. *Revista Espanola de Teologia* is edited by the Francisco Suarez Institute, a branch of the Superior Council of Scientific Research. The latter is published under the supervision of the Most Rev. Leopoldo Eljo y Garay, Bishop of Madrid, and with the cooperation of two professors from the Seminary.

'CZECHO-SLOVAKIAN NIGHT' FOR SOLDIERS AT NCCS CLUB
