PRESS EULOGIZES PRIEST KILLED IN AUTO ACCIDENT

BOGOTA — The Rev. Father Girardo, the victim of a fatal motor accident, has been eulogized by the press for his exemplary, charitable and virtuous life. Originally from Antioquia, since his coming to Bogota in 1925, Father Girardo had built a church, by popular subscription, and dedicated it to the Blessed Virgin. He was well known to reporters as the priest who stayed at the police court until all hours of the night, almost every night, in case the victims of an accident of some moment might need the services of a priest. He also visited the prisons regularly to teach Christian Doctrine.
