**Assistant Pastor Goes To St. Josephat's**

The Rev. J. M. Schmonduik has been assigned as assistant pastor of St. Josephat's Ukrainian Catholic Church on Hudson Avenue of which the Rev. Basil Turula is pastor.

St. Josephat's Church is a Catholic Church of the Slav-Byzantine Rite which is under the jurisdiction of His Excellency, the Most Rev. Constantine Bohachevsky, D.D. of Philadelphia, Pa.

The new assistant pastor was born in Wilmerding, Pa., on Aug. 6, 1912. He received his elementary education in Wilmerding and Philadelphia and from there went to St. Joseph's Preparatory School at Philadelphia for four years. Studied in Rome.

In October of 1930, Father Schmonduik sailed for Rome where he studied for the priesthood at St. Josephat's Pontifical Seminary, which was just completed by funds made possible through Pope Pius XI. This is a Seminary where young Ukrainian Catholics aspiring for the priesthood from the United States, Canada, Brazil, Ukraine, Rumania and Czechoslovakia undergo their training. St. Josephat's Seminary, although actually situated in Rome outside the Vatican cordons and being a Pontifical Institution, enjoys extra-territorial rites of the Vatican State.

Father Schmonduik pursued his philosophical studies at the Angelicum University which is conducted by the Dominican Fathers and his theological studies at the Propaganda of the Faith University.

After six years, he completed his studies having attained a Licentiate Degree in Sacred Theology. He was ordained to the priesthood on March 29, 1938, in Rome by His Excellency, the Most Rev. Alexander Stojka, Bishop of Munkacs of Czechoslovakia.

On his return from Europe, Father Schmonduik's first assignment by Bishop Bohachevsky was as pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Ukrainian Catholic Church of Alliquippa, Pa., which is approximately 13 miles outside of Pittsburgh. This he held for six consecutive years until last week when he was assigned to St. Josephat's Church.

**BISHOP O'HARA ADDRESSES NUNS AT LITURGICAL WEEK**
