GUATEMALA.—(NC)—A national congress to consider the grave problem of the lack of priests in this country has been called by the Most Rev. Mariano Rosell Aréllano, Archbishop of Guatemala, for the first week in September. In calling the congress, the Archbishop said that a good part of the rural population "never sees a priest or, at most, once a year," and that even in the cities and towns where there are priests "they find it impossible to attend properly to the most urgent spiritual needs that confront them in so wide a field."
