

# Extra Bond Purchase Opens Doors To 'Heroes Salute'

September has been designated as "SALUTE TO OUR HEROES" month in the campaign of the United States Treasury Department to sell one billion dollars worth of bonds in these thirty days. The motion picture industry is collaborating with the U. S. Treasury in



this tremendous effort and there is every hope that it will be achieved. Flying squadrons of movie stars will visit every city of size in the country and Rochester will be favored with a visit from Miss Irene Dunne, one of the most popular of all the screen favorites. Miss Dunne will be the feature attraction at a musical entertainment to be staged at the Eastman Theatre on Sunday evening, Sept. 13, at 8 o'clock. Appearing on the program will be the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and several soloists. In addition it is expected to have an address by a famous war correspondent recently returned from the far-eastern battle zone. A dramatic feature will be the actual induction of a soldier into service.

During the month there will be other spectacular rallies, including a street dance and the appearance of the Bondmobile, a motorless car that carries effigies of Hitler, Hirohito and Mussolini. It is being pushed across the state with each bond buyer being given the right to give it a shove. When it gets to Niagara Falls it will be pushed over the brink.

W. B. Potter is chairman of the Rochester committee in charge of the September bond campaign and heading the special Theatre Committee are Jacob Golden, Lester Pollock and Saul Silverman. Walter L. Todd heads the special Commandos Committee and Mrs. E. Emmett Finucane, Mrs. J. R. Booth and Mrs. J. McLean Pratt, the Women's Committee.

Bond booths have been installed at the downtown houses and the Schine neighborhood theatres and all this week every purchaser of an extra bond will receive two tickets for the Eastman Theatre entertainment that will be headlined by Irene Dunne. Rochester's quota for the month of September has been placed at \$14,500,000.

## All-Catholic Award Won By Student Publications

Student publications of three Catholic institutions of higher learning for girls in Rochester, won the All-Catholic award, highest rating given in the annual survey and rating of the Catholic School Press Association. It was announced Sept. 4, at the headquarters of the association at the Marquette University College of Journalism, Milwaukee.

The awards were as follows: Magazines, major universities and colleges, Verity Fair, Nazareth College, Rochester, High Schools and Academies for Girls, Mercedes, Our Lady of Mercy High School, Rochester.

Newspapers, Colleges for Women, The Gleamer, Nazareth College, Rochester, High Schools and Academies for Girls, The Gabriel, Nazareth Academy, Rochester.

The announcement was made by Dr. J. L. O'Sullivan, Director of the Catholic School Press Association and Dean of the Marquette College of Journalism.

The rating All-Catholic is based on three judges' estimate of the publications. In the judging, 300 points is allowed for the effectiveness of the publication in points for physical appearance, 100 points for style, 75 points for headline construction and 50 points for application of art to news and features.

To be given the All-Catholic rating, the publication must have earned an average of at least 900 points from each of the three judges.
