## FEAST OF SEVEN DOLORS

AUBURN—Next Tuesday, September 15, is the Feast of the Seven Dolors of Our Blessed Mother. On that day we recall the seven dolors of Mary as follows: (1) The Prophecy of Simeon, (2) The Flight into Egypt, (3) The Loss of Jesus in the Temple, (4) Mary meets Jesus carrying His cross, (5) The Crucifixion, (6) The taking down from the Cross and (7) The Burial of Jesus.

On this feast day all sodalists belonging to sodalities affiliated with the Prima Primaria in Rome may gain a plenary indulgence by receiving the sacraments of penance and the Holy Eucharist and by praying for the Pope.

The Right Rev. Monsignor Fulton J. Sheen in his booklet "Queen of Seven Sorrows, thy Seven Dolors are like a Holy Mass. In thy first dolor, thou wert appointed sacristan by Simeon to keep the Host until the Hour of sacrifice; in thy second dolor, thou didst leave the sanctuary to serve the altar as thy Son's visit sanctified Egypt; in the third dolor, thou didst recite the Confiteor at the foot of the altar as thy Son recited His Confiteor to the Doctors of the Law; thy fourth Dolor was the Oratory as thou didst make the oblation of His Body and Blood on the way to Calvary; thy fifth dolor was the consecration in which thou didst offer thine own body and blood in union with thy Son's for the redemption of the world; thy sixth dolor was the Communion when thou didst receive the body of thy Son from the altar of the Cross; and thy seventh dolor was the Its Mass eat, as thou didst and thy sorrow with an adieu to the tomb."

"Mary thy Heart is everything to us; it is a living altar-stone on which the sacrifice is offered; it is the sanctuary lamp which jumps with joy before its God; it is the server, the beatings of which are like the responses of the liturgy; it is the Paschal candle which lights the sanctuary of our souls by the sacrifice of self; it is the thurible which gives the sweet odor of incense as it burns in love of us; it is a whole angelic choir singing voiceless songs into ravished ears of the bleeding Host, Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

John Sexton Kennedy in his booklet "A Mass with Mary" has the following thought: "A glory of new stars, downward flung

And forged into seven swords, has stung the heart of the Woman whom I pass On my way to the altar for morning Mass. There is no shrill crowd, there are no hoarse cries, But I meet One bearing a cross, in her eyes."
