**Father Vogt Completes

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — Twenty
 priests were among 151 Army

 from the Army Chaplain School at
 Harvard University. Each chaplain
 received a diploma, in token of
 successful completion of the course,
 from the hands of Father William
 D. Cleary, commandant of the
 school, a priest of the Brooklyn
 Diocese.

The benediction at the exercises
 was given by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. A.
 P. Hickey, pastor of St. Paul's
 Church, Cambridge.

Among the graduates was Father
 John Walter Bowman, S.V.D., of
 Lafayette, La., who, when he was
 commissioned some weeks ago, be-
 came the first colored Catholic
 chaplain serving in the United
 States Army.
