Prayers For Servicemen Asked At Graves Ceremony

While offering fervent prayers for beloved ones resting in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, the estimated 4,000 persons attending the Blessing of the Graves ceremony, Sunday, were exhorted to offer their prayers also for soldiers and sailors called to their eternal reward during the first year of this country's participation in the global war.

It was at the close of the impressive ceremony, the first since America entered the war, that His Excellency, Bishop Kearney from a platform outside All Souls' Chapel addressed the crowd and interjected the appeal to remember the souls of departed men in service.

In the traditional manner, His Excellency, escorted by students of St. Bernard's and St. Andrew's Seminaries and Rochester Regiment, Knights of St. John in command of Col. Frederick J. Weg-

man proceeded from St. Bernard's Seminary and through the beautifully landscaped lanes of the Cemetery.

Accompanying the Bishop were the Rt. Rev. Magr. William F. Bergen, Chancellor of the Diocese, and the Rt. Rev. Magr. James J. Hartley, P. A. rector emeritus of St. Bernard's Seminary. The Rev. Lawrence B. Casey, vice chancellor of the diocese, was master of ceremonies.

The Seminary choir which chanted the liturgy for the occasion was directed by the Rev. Benedict Ehmman of St. Bernard's Seminary.

As is customary, His Excellency, Bishop Kearney and the Monsignor paused at the Bishops' Crypt in All Souls' Chapel to remember in their prayers the repose of the souls of Archbishop Thomas F. Hickey and Bishops Bernard J. McQuaid and John Francis O'Hern who lie at rest there.
