### Heads CYA Group Seeking Children's Memberships

John D. Hayes, president of the Fanny Farmer Company will serve as chairman of the special committee in the annual membership drive of the Columbus Youth Association which opens Thursday, October 1.

Announcement of the selection of Mr. Hayes was made by the Rev. Gerald C. Lambert, director of the CYA.

### Skaneateles Property Given Syracuse Diocese

AUBURN—The Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Syracuse have received as a gift, the summer estate of the F. Harris Nichols family of Greenwich, Conn., which is located at Tea Mile Point, Skaneateles Lake.

Announcement of the gift was made on Saturday by Most Rev. Walter A. Foery, Bishop of the Syracuse Diocese and former priest of the Rochester Diocese. The camp will be known as the Lourdes Camp for Children in memory of Clarinda Myers Nichols, wife of Mr. Nichols, who lost her life in early July when fire broke out in one of the lodges of the property. Mr. Nichols is president of the General Chemical Company of New York and a former resident of Syracuse.

The estate is valued at \$300,000 and consists of approximately fifty acres. All of the buildings on the property as well as all of the furnishings are included with the gift. The buildings include a main building with living room, dining room, kitchen, storage rooms, bathrooms and three bedrooms; a lodge, containing at least five bedrooms, bathroom and living room; a large bathhouse, caretaker's house and garage. There is also a tennis court, several canoes and rowboats included with the gift. The deed

for the property was transferred to Catholic Charities of Syracuse on Saturday, Sept. 12. Augustus C. Stevens, Syracuse attorney handling the transfer for Mr. Nichols.

Bishop Foery announced that the Lourdes Camp will replace the Morning Star Manor, Catholic Camp for children at Little York, Tully Lake. Eight cabins occupied by campers at Morning Star will be moved to Skaneateles. The Morning Star Camp was first started in 1923 and during the past season 604 children between the ages of seven and sixteen years attended camping periods there. Rev. M. Shields Dwyer, diocesan youth director, was director at Morning Star Manor. Bishop Foery did not state what he would do with the Morning Star property.

Officers of the Catholic Charities of which Bishop Foery is president, consist of Rt. Rev. Magr. Daniel Deady of Utica, Rt. Rev. Magr. David C. Cunningham and Rev. J. James Benson of Fayetteville.

### 'Alive and Well' Chaplain Writes From Japan Camp

PEMBROKE, Ont.—In his last letter home since the fall of Hong Kong last Christmas, Rev. F. J. Delaney, Catholic chaplain with the Canadian Armed Forces, writes to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James Delaney, that he is "alive and well" and that "there is no cause for worry."

"I am able to provide religious services regularly for all Catholics in the camp," Father Delaney states in his letter from a Japanese internment camp. His letter was very brief but he says he will be pleased to write once a month to return.

While in Pembroke, Father Delaney taught for six years in the Catholic parishes of Ontario. One of his pupils was Cardinal Thomas George Dewey, who is now a member of the Canadian Parliament and is able to attend Father Delaney's Mass every morning.

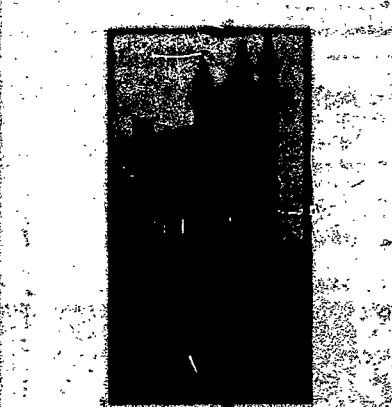

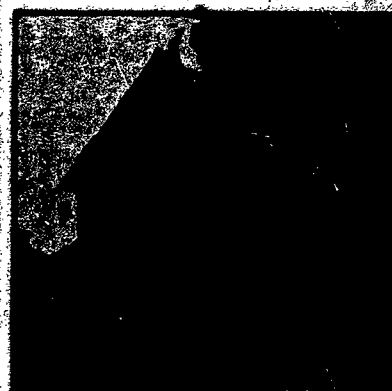
