

Officials Authorize Erection of Peace Shrine in City Park

NEW ORLEANS -- The New Orleans commission council has authorized erection of a statue of the Blessed Virgin in City Park as a peace shrine and as a commemoration of the Eighth National Eucharistic Congress of 1938, many services of which were held in the City Park stadium.

The statue, to be known as "Our Lady of Peace" is to be placed under the canopy of the Eucharistic Congress altar. Plans are to obtain bids from sculptors for a life-size statue costing approximately \$2,200.



Free Naturalization Help Offered Aliens

Beginning last week and continuing over the next three weeks, a total of 10,000 letters will be mailed to as many alien residents of Rochester and Monroe County, by the U. S. Department of Justice, Immigration and Naturalization Service. This letter offers experienced assistance and advice to local aliens in making out naturalization application papers--free of charge.

Eighteen free, morning, afternoon and evening "Naturalization Aide Meetings" will be made available, every week for the next six weeks, in six conveniently located aide centers--as follows:
