

Catholic Charities Maps Seventh Annual Dinner

Plans for the Seventh Annual Dinner of Elmira Catholic Charities were made at a special meeting of the Board of Directors at the Hotel Langwell, Wednesday noon, September 12.

This agency event which is accorded to be the leading cultural function in Elmira was attended last year by a capacity crowd of five hundred and sixty-five persons.

The principal speaker this year will be the Rev. Robert I. Gannon, S.J., President of Postdam University of New York City. Father Gannon is acknowledged as one of the most eloquent and popular orators in the United States.
