Minister of Interior Darío Echandía represented the Government at the ceremony which was also attended by members of the Supreme Court, the Senate and House of Representatives, and the Cathedral Chapters of Garzon, Barranquilla and Socorro.

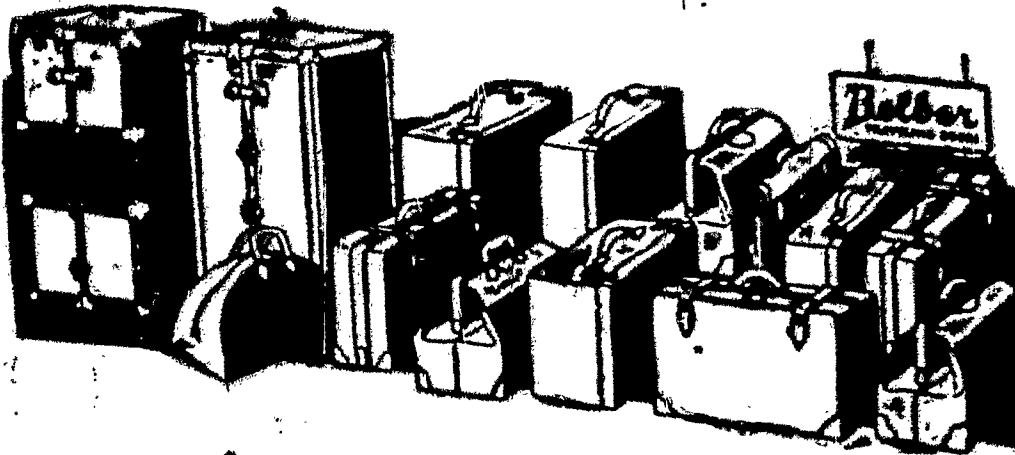
