JERSEY CITY—Three St. Columban's Missionaries from Korea were among the American nationals who landed here from the repatriation ship Gripsholm.

They are the Revs. Harold W. Henry, Minneapolis; Patrick T. Brennan, Chicago, and Thomas P. Kane, Chicago. All three were imprisoned last December with the rest of the St. Columban's priests in Korea, but their status was later changed to interment.

Remaining in Korea, the three priests revealed, are 25 of their fellow missionaries of the St. Columban's Society, Irish nationals, who were recognized as neutrals last March and released from internment. They are maintaining mission activity in the two large territories entrusted to the Society.
