'Alive and Well' Chaplain Writes From Japan Camp

PEMBROKE, Ont.—In his last letter home about the fall of Hong Kong last Christmas, Rev. J. Deloughery, Catholic chaplain with the Canadian Armed Forces, wrote to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James Deloughery, that he is "alive and well" and that "there is no cause for worry."

"I am able to provide religious services regularly for all Catholics in the camp," Father Deloughery states in his letter from a Japanese internment camp. His letter was very brief but he says he will be allowed to write once a month in future.

Deloughery thought for two years in the Catholic internment camp, which was in the Japanese hands. He is now in a Japanese camp and is able to attend Mass on Deloughery's Mass every morning.

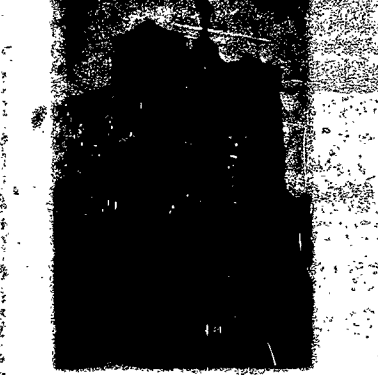
