MUM'S GOLDEN JUBILEE TO BE FITTINGLY OBSERVED

Fifty years of zealous and devoted service in religious life will be observed by Sister Kustachik, teacher of the fourth grade in Our Lady of Perpetual Help School. On Friday morning at 9 A. M. the occasion will be marked by the celebration of St. Stanislaus High Mass by the pastor, the Rev. Francis J. Hoefen, with the reverend assistants acting as deacon and sub-deacon. Members of the congregation, the school children and friends will attend the Mass.

Fifty years ago, Sister Kustachik began her teaching career at the Catholic Orphan Asylum at Auburn, followed by service at St. Francis Xavier School of this city, then at St. Alphonsus School at Auburn, Holy Trinity School at Webster, and St. John's at Greece. For the past thirty-two years, this

devoted nun has been stationed at Our Lady of Perpetual Help School.

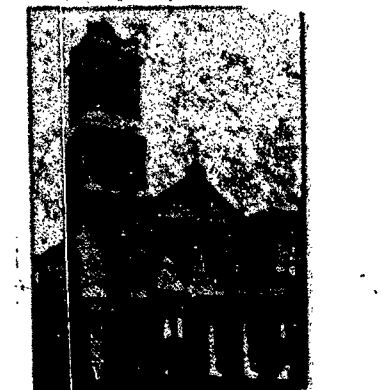

HIGH SCHOOL RELIGION

Delayed for one week, the classes in religious instruction for pupils attending public high school will begin on next Monday, September 28. Those who have not attended these classes before must have release cards signed by their parents in order to be excused from school for instruction. Without the cooperation of parents, upon whom rests chiefly the obligation to provide religious education for their children, little will be accomplished. Boys and girls in public grammar schools will also begin their instructions on next Monday. They will be given each week at Blessed Sacrament school at 4 o'clock. Parents with children in public schools are urged to see to it that their

children attend these classes in religion each week.

Adult Homemaker Classes Open

The safeguarding of children and the family is of first importance to the country at all times. During this world emergency the home has been frequently mentioned as the first line of defense. As a result, the responsibility of the homemaker is being increasingly

recognized and the quality of family life more appreciated.

Mrs. Isabel Barnett, Supervisor of the Adult Education program of the Home Economics Department, today announced that home economic classes for adults will be held in almost every elementary school this year.

Instruction in clothing, home-making, foods and home management, children's clothing, millinery, and household arts will be offered.

Classes are now beginning, and will continue through March 25. Registration fee is 50c and there is no tuition charge for Rochester residents. Further information may be obtained from the Board of Education Home Economics Department or from the principal in your neighborhood elementary school.

Elderly Irish Woman Honored By Pope For Long Aid To Missions

DUBLIN — For her outstanding and life-long work for the propagation of the Faith, Miss Rosanna Byrne, an elderly and feeble Dublin woman, has had conferred on her by His Holiness Pope Pius XII the Medal of Merit.

The decoration was presented to her by Rt. Rev. Msgr. P. J. Walsh, President and National Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, at the headquarters in Dublin.

For 40 years Miss Byrne has been making a round of daily calls through the streets and byways of Dublin on her whole-time quest for pennies for the missions. In that time she has collected about \$100,000 for this cause. Though she never keeps records of the names of her subscribers, she never fails to round them up when their modest subscriptions fall due. She knows them all and few will escape her watchfulness.

Miss Byrne attends daily Mass, a practice all her life and devotes the rest of the day to her mission work.

KAP Reports Salesians Died In Nazi Prison

LONDON.—Four of 14 Salesians arrested by the Nazis at Cracow and sent to the Oswiecim concentration camp are reported to have died there, according to word received here by the Polish Catholic Press Agency, KAP.

Those reported to have died are Fathers Wierci, Dobies, Wojciechowski and Franciszek Harasim, a professor at the University of Cracow. Of the 14 arrested, it was stated, twelve were priests.
