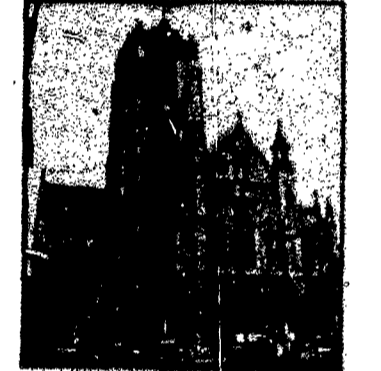

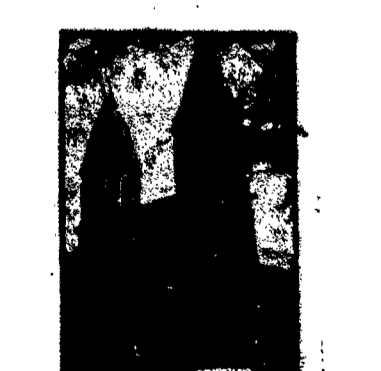

## FINGERPRINT TRAINING NOW GIVEN ARMY CHAPLAINS

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — One important item in the training of chaplains at the Army Chaplain School at Harvard University here aims to produce a group of chaplains who will be expert in fingerprinting, so that "unknown soldiers' graves will be fewer on the battlefields of this war than they were in 1917-18.

In revealing that fingerprint training is now being given chaplains, Father William D. Cleary, priest with the rank of colonel who commands the school, said that "If Army chaplains of the last war had the training the Army is now giving its chaplains, many soldiers who were buried as unknowns on the battlefield would have been identified by means of fingerprints and other methods."
