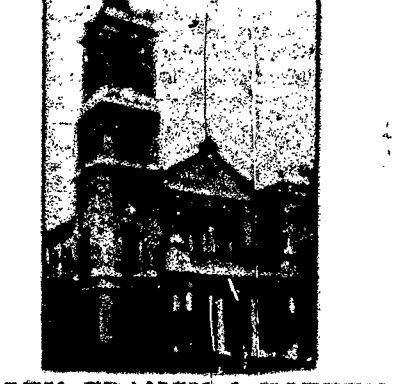

Final Tribute Paid Esteemed Layman

A throng of priests, fellow-laymen and friends joined in a final tribute to John L. Keenan, highly esteemed Catholic layman, at funeral services in Blessed Sacrament Church, Monday, Sept. 28. (See Editorial, Page 18)

Mr. Keenan, who was president of Franklin Institute and the Keenan Advertising Agency, died from a heart attack at his home, 840 East Ave., Sept. 25, 1942.

Requiem Mass was offered by the Rev. Thomas F. Connors, pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, where Mr. Keenan had been an active member.

Bearers were Harry B. Crowley, William T. Nolan, Michael Lawless, Lawrence Cleary, Emil Meng and Dr. Leo F. Simpson.

Mr. Keenan was born in Rochester in 1881, son of James and Isabel Keenan. A graduate of Cathedral School, he established the widely known correspondence school at 840 East Ave in 1904.

A charter member and vice-president of the Rochester Charities Board of Trustees, Mr. Keenan in 1917 organized a campaign which resulted in \$77,000 being raised for central financing of the Charities. At the silver jubilee celebration in June of this year, the continuous vice-president since the Board was organized 25 years ago, served as toastmaster at the dinner.

Long active in the Knights of Columbus, he was elected president of the Knights of Columbus Building Association in 1928. He was a Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus and was also a director of the Union Trust Company.

Mr. Keenan is survived by his wife, Florence Rice Keenan; four sons, John L. Jr., Edward J., Richard M. and Thomas A. Keenan, and two sisters, Grace Keenan and Mrs. Walter A. Knapp.

Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.
