Two books by Notre Dame authors of established reputation make their appearance in September. Father Leo R. Ward, whose "Holding Up the Hills," an Iowa folk story, has been a popular successor to his "God in An Irish Kitchen," is bringing out through Sheed & Ward a promising volume, "Nova Scotia, Land of Co-Operatives." Richard T. Sullivan, professor of English and prominent short story writer, is the author of a first novel, "Summer After Summer" (Doubleday, Doran & Co.). 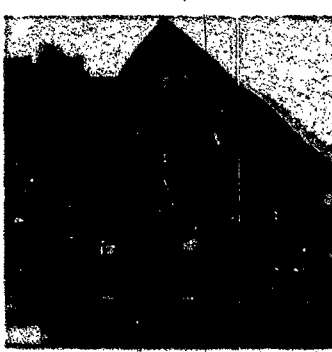
