Marjorie Main plays her as nobly as Marjorie Main plays anything. Her two cronies are Aline MacMahon and Zasu Pitts, two able actresses, who are both back in New York for stage plays. Let's hope the plays are good enough to remove the bad

taste left by "Tish." The American audience to be sure of the more palatable leading man, James Frawley again shows promise and Richard Coase is a likable youngster.

Donna Andrews and Richard Carlson, two young actors who have shown considerable promise in the past, don't have much chance to show anything in their latest picture which are respectively "Backs Commandment" and "Highway to Nowhere." The latter, another excellent young actor, has the principal role in "The Great Commandment," a moving, sad and sincere picture which opens at the Little on Saturday. "The Great Commandment" has received the endorsement of representatives of all religious groups, as well as that of critics. One of the most exciting events of the theater season was George Forman's magnificent opera, "Torch and Rose," which was brought here in a brilliant production last week.
