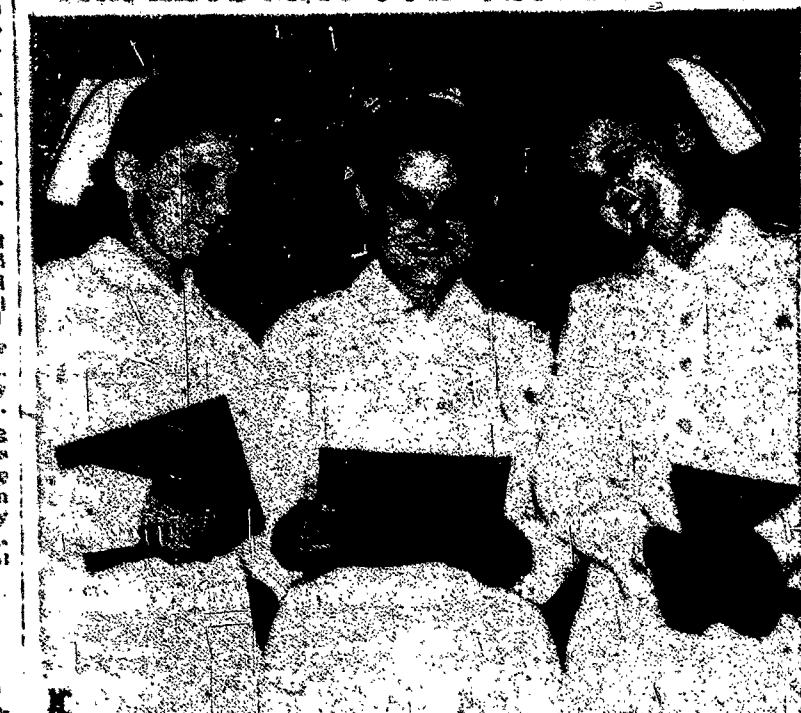
The breakfast will be served by members of Court St. Joseph 139, Catholic Daughters of America.

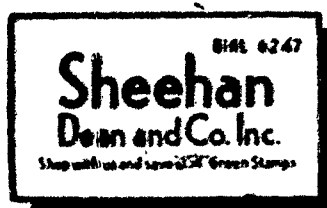
## Fordham Club Organized In Mexico
