Women-Students At St. Bonaventure's

ST. BONAVENTURE, N. Y. - St. Bonaventure College upst a tradition of nearly one hundred years standing this week, when it was decided by the college authorities to admit women-students as regular day students at the Franciscan Institution.

In the past, attendance of women from Olean and nearby towns and cities has been limited to extension classes, held evenings from Monday through Friday during the school year. In announcing this change to coeducational attendance at the College, Rev. Cornelius A. Welch, O.F.M., Registrar, said: "The present emergency has necessitated a change of policy for the duration of the war. Numerous applicants from women for day attendance have reached the Office of Studies because of difficulties experienced in attending night classes."

Fr. Cornelius Anthony explained that the difficulties included lack of available transportation as well as the part-time employment of women in defense work. This made it difficult for many women students in this section to continue their college training and obtain college credit. "For this reason," concluded Fr. Cornelius, "the Faculty of St. Bonaventure College, desirous of fully cooperating with the government in the present emergency and of rendering every available service to this community, has decided to open the day program of studies to women students."

Red Cross Blood Donor Record Set At Seminary Of Divine Word Fathers

CHICAGO. - Volunteers for blood plasma at St. Mary's Mission House in Techy, Ill., seminary of the Society of the Divine Word, established a record in the blood donor service of the American Red Cross. When the Red Cross set up its mobile unit for a day, the unit exhausted its supply of bottles, the count averaging 117 bottles. The previous high mark was 115.

The Red Cross had hoped for 100 volunteers from the Mission House but found the quota quickly surpassed. No less than 150 priests, seminarians and Brothers contributed. So few were rejected for reasons of health, age or convalescence from operations, that when the day's supply of bottles was exhausted many volunteers were turned away.
