

400 CYA WORKERS GET 'MARCHING ORDERS'

2,250 Memberships Objective Set For First Wartime Drive

A campaign army of some 400 men and women will get its "marching orders" from the Most Rev. James E. Kearney tonight (Thursday, Oct. 1) at a dinner at The Sagamore, opening the eleventh annual membership drive of the Columbus Youth Association.

In its first war-time drive for members, the CYA is seeking to sign up 2,250 men and women, boys and girls before the close of the campaign on Columbus Day, October 12.

Sharing the speaker's platform with Bishop Kearney at tonight's dinner will be Major Frederick A. Tillman, commanding officer of the Rochester Recruiting and Induction Center, Norman A. O'Brien, general chairman of the drive will act as toastmaster.

The occasion will be a happy one for the parishioners of All Saints Church as the visit of the Bishop coincides with the completion of the work of decorating the interior of the church. The work has been expertly done by Professor Giuseppe Reggi, a master of ecclesiastical art, who has won honor and distinction here and abroad, having

been honored by the title of Knight of St. Gregory by His Holiness, Pope Pius XII. The decoration will include the afternoon service to which the people of the community are cordially invited.

The Bishop and his party will take dinner at Our Lady of the Lake Rectory in Ithaca, where he will be joined by the Rt. Rev. Messrs. Joseph Damiano, Rector of Immaculate Conception Church in Rochester, Very Rev. John Conway, Dean of Auburn, Rev. Patrick Geary, a Maryland Missionary, recently returned from internment in Manchuria, Rev. William A. Geiger, Rector of Holy Redeemer Church in Rochester, Rev. John Sullivan, Rector of St. John's Church in Rochester and Rev. William Hafferty, pastor of St. Joseph's and a former boy of this parish.

At 7:30 P. M. members and guests of the parish will meet in the Bishop and Clergyman in the presence of the community where His Excellency will give the prayer and Anointing of the Sick group of Holy Matrons, which has recently been started by members of the Holy Family in honor of their deceased parents.

Confirmation of a class of twenty-five children and four adults will follow immediately in Our Lady of the Lake Church. The people of the community are cordially invited by the Pastor to be in attendance.

Social Encyclicals Of Pope Pius XI Presented In Book

ST. LOUIS — With the announced purpose of clarifying their thinking on the problems of peace in time of war, the Encyclicals dealing with social reconstruction written by the late Pope Pius XI, are presented with annotations in the book, "Social Writings, Vol. IV," by the Rev. Joseph Humbert, S.J., of St. Louis University, general editor of the Series and late Vice Rector, Father Houston performed the same service in presenting the social Encyclicals of Pope Leo XIII in an earlier volume of "Social Writings." The book is being distributed through the Bruce Publishing Company, Milwaukee.

The Encyclicals included in his latest volume are: Christian Education of Youth, The Mexican Revolution, Invictus in Catholicism, Spain, Position of the Church in Germany, Atheistic Communism, Peace Through the Holy Sacred Heart and World Dictates, and the famous Quadragesimal Aeneas.
