The fall camping schedule for the Holy Family Scouts is now in full swing. Between sixteen to twenty boys will leave for this week-end to be spent at Camp Warren Center, Scout Reservation. Each Scout will hike from the Bress to the Camp with an average pack of thirty pounds on his back.

Troop 212 will carry their light-weight packs and tents. These tents were made at home by the Scouts and waterproofed during this past spring and summer.

While at Camp, the Scouts will engage in advancement programs, ranging from regular Scout advancement to intensive Merit Badge work. The Merit Badge work includes Pioneering, Camping and Bird Study.

One of the projects to be worked on during this fall and winter is the making of light-weight sleeping bags and, also, the adding of more equipment to their present packs for light-weight camping and hiking.

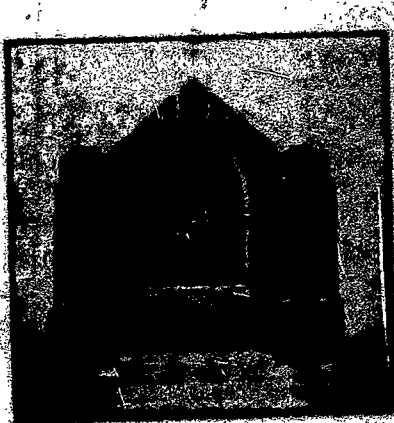

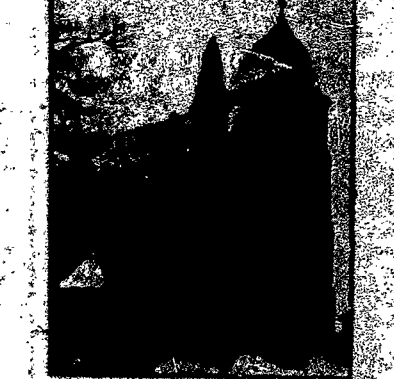
