servicemen in this part of the state.

In the USO Club program activity will include home hospitality, parties, dancing, suppers and refreshments in conjunction with different socials, sports and games, special club activities such as photography and hobbies of like nature, and recreational events as needed by and asked for by the servicemen themselves.

In the community itself, through the local NCCS Committee, religious activities for Catholic men will be sponsored weekly in such ways

as Communion Breakfasts, religious discussion groups, retreats and days of deliberation, and the usual parish religious opportunities.

In this type of program the church facilities, St. Stephen's Club, the Retreat House of the Redemptorist Fathers, and neighboring parish facilities will be coordinated under the leadership of Father McPadden, Monsignor Walter J. Lee, and Father McPadden's assistant, Father Raymond Nolan.

The permanent USO Club is not expected to be completed, because of priority materials and the difficulties of obtaining skilled labor, before Feb. 1.

I saw "Porgy and Bess" again when it came to Rochester last week—saw it at every performance as a matter of fact. When the opportunity to see it again in Buffalo presented itself, I took it. I hope to see it many times again. There's a good possibility that it may return to Rochester after an extended Chicago run. If it does, don't miss it—even if you have seen it. 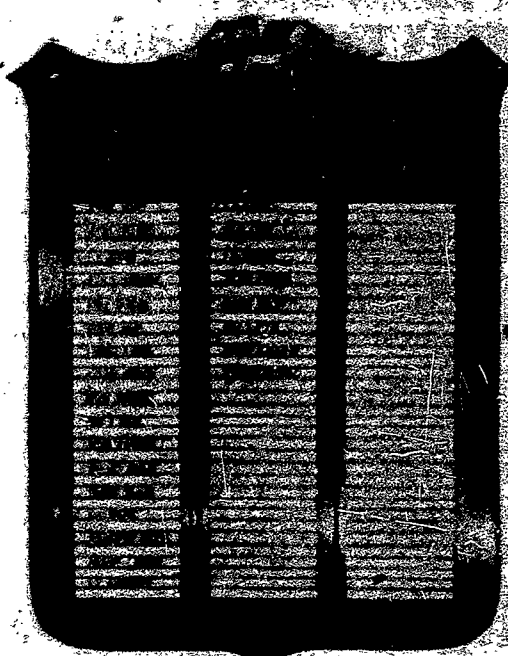
