Spiritual Directors Named

AUBURN — St. Alphonsus Parish has announced the spiritual directors of the various organizations in the Parish. Rev. Gerard Amann will be in charge of the Sodality of Mary and the Rosary Society; Rev. John Merklinger of the Holy Name Society and the Catholic Action Society; and Rev. Gerard Gefell has charge of the Altar Boys. There are two Boy Scout Troops in the Parish. Father Amann has charge of Troop 21 and Father Merklinger is the director of Troop 12. The Girl Scouts also have two troops. Father Merklinger takes care of Troop 8 and Father Amann is directing Troop 12.

TEACH RELIGION

The priests of the parish also are the instructors in religion in the school. Father Gefell is teaching in the first, second and third grades; Father Amann, in the fourth, fifth and sixth grades and Father Merklinger in the seventh and eighth grades. There are classes in catechism on Saturday morning for the pupils attending the public schools who are members of the parish. Father Gefell is in charge of the sixth, seventh and eighth grades; Father Amann, the third, fourth and fifth grades, and Father Straub, pastor of St. Alphonsus, teaches the second grade pupils.

FORM JUNIOR COMMANDOS

AUBURN—A Junior Commandos has been organized at St. Hyacinth's School to canvass the Polish section of Auburn for all extra scrap metals. The Commandos will be assigned to the various streets in the Polish section of the city. They will assemble next Saturday morning in the school yard at 8:30, each with a bicycle and mounted tray, small express wagons and carts. After a group song program the Commandos will march on to their routes, and deliver the collected scrap back to the school yard where it will be piled up. At four o'clock movies will be taken and the program will close with songs and lunch. The material will be sold and the money realized will be used for the purchase of stationary and Christmas cards to be sent to the soldier boys of the parish. The number of the boys in the service from St. Hyacinth's Parish has reached 392. Each classroom is praying for the group of parish soldiers assigned to them. Each pupil in the school will write a Christmas message to their soldier group.
