In addition to this, I believe music appreciation will be gained by the members. We are very fortunate in having Mr. Hasenauer assume the leadership of this orchestra."

Columbus Held By Niagara U. Speaker As Example Today

"The spirit of Columbus is needed today," declared the Rev. James J. Corbett, C. M., professor of Philosophy, Niagara University, Niagara Falls, N. Y., addressing the Tenth Annual Mixer of the Niagara University College of Business Administration held Monday evening, Oct. 12 at the Seneca Hotel.

Father Corbett has spent many years as a missionary to China was in Kanchow at the time of the Communist's uprising and is at present army chaplain at Fort Niagara.

"The world today marks this anniversary," he continued, "and it is well that it should do so. Columbus was a man of faith. It was that faith in all its stubborn nature that made possible an achievement such as was his discovery of a new route to the other side of the world."

"On this occasion while war wages in the world and American forces are scattered throughout Asia, Europe and Africa we should do well to pause and try to recapture some of that stubborn faith, indomitable will, fortitude, imagination and spiritual fibre of Christopher Columbus, the Navigator."

Can Lose All

"America is now going through days of severe trial. Our legions have contacted the enemy on several fronts. How well the lessons of liberty have been learned by us will be reflected in the final outcome of the titanic struggle now unfolding before our eyes. Without faith, courage, stubborn persistence in the principles of religion and an unwavering loyalty to America's political credo we can lose all that we have gained in 150 years since the haggard and fearless navigator echoed in the virgin forest that cry which makes America great. 'For God and Country.'"

Father Corbett pointed out to the students and faculty assembled that modern thinkers who have pursued the ways of agnosticism have only succeeded in erecting the walls of doubt which have staggered human progress. But it is America," he said "fortified with faith in God, who will never have to doubt the character of its political credo, Liberty Equality and Justice."
