

**Divine Intervention Saved Britain In Blitz, Air Marshal Declares**

LONDON—His personal conviction that Britain would have lost the war some time ago but for Divine intervention was expressed by Air Chief Marshal Sir Hugh Dowding, who is not a Catholic, when a group of "Battle of Britain" pilots celebrated the second anniversary of the day on which 185 Nazi planes were shot down during a sustained attack on this country.

**Seek Blessed Mother's Mediation For Peace**

LOS ANGELES — "The wine of gladness has run out" at the wedding feast of life and "only God can restore it to our lives," writes the Most Rev. John J. Cantwell, Archbishop of Los Angeles, in a pastoral letter read in the churches here last Sunday.

Urging increased devotion to the Blessed Mother and the Rosary during October, the pastoral stresses that Mary is present in life's "wedding feast wherein God is united to our poor humanity." "In these terrible days," says the Archbishop, men can acquaint Mary with the necessity for the "wine of gladness." "God will restore peace to us again," he declares, "but He will restore it to us only through Mary. But first she must be invited to the wedding feast. She will intercede for us if we are willing to do whatsoever He will say to us to do. The will of God is clearly evident. The water of our human misery will not be turned into the wine of peace, except through the mediation of Mary."

The letter instructs that from October 1 to the end of the war the Rosary and Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary be solemnly recited in all the churches of the archdiocese every day. He also urges that at least one decade of the Rosary be recited in the classrooms of the archdiocesan schools each day.

**250,000 CATHOLIC WOMEN AT MEXICO MEETING**

MEXICO CITY—More than 240 delegates, representing a quarter of a million members, attended the Eighth National Convention of Mexican Catholic Women.

In the interest of "the future of our country," the Convention advocated an extensive plan for "family life education for girls, young women and even wives who now find themselves confronted with grave problems within their own homes."
