VATICAN CITY—The baptismal font where Giovanni Maria Mastai Ferretti was baptized on May 13, 1792, has been restored. On June 18, 1846, the infant baptized at Senigallia 45 years before, became Pope Pius IX. The baptismal font was restored in 1882 as a part of the centennial ceremonies, but the infiltration of water and the dampness of the ancient walls had caused some damage to the golden font during the last half-century.

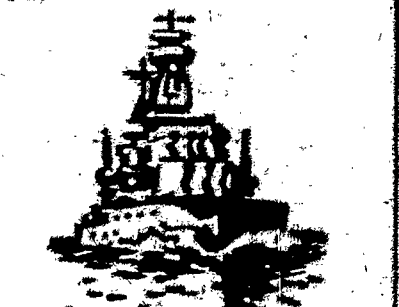

# Work Of Reinforcement In Crypt Of Vatican Basilica Progresses

VATICAN CITY—The massive work of reinforcement being carried out in the crypt of the Vatican Basilica at the Eternal City, which stands over the mass slabs of the Roman Empire, is progressing.

More than 1,000 workers were required for the reinforcement of the crypt. This work is necessary for the important excavations to be continued in the vicinity of the Tomb of St. Peter.

A steam hoist, used with 1942 was the first hoist in the Washington Monument. The monument is 555 feet, 5 1/2 inches high.
