

# Charities Dinner Speaker Is Noted Jesuit Educator

The Elmira Catholic Charities has scheduled its seventh annual dinner for Thursday evening, October 22 at the Mark Twain Hotel, at which event the Rev. Robert J. Gannon, S.J., president of Fordham University, will be the principal speaker.

Only a year ago, Father Gannon was one of the many loyal Americans who felt that "this was not our war." Today, however, he has declared that "this is our war as it is, I am ready to confess that we were wrong and President Roosevelt was right. It was our war from the first."

In connection with the present-day conditions, Father Gannon has also expressed his approval of a perpetual post-war draft. He believes that "our young men will profit from a year's military training and will be saved a year of wasted time that has always characterized American education."

Fr. Gannon was born in New York City in 1893 and graduated from Loyola School, New York, in 1909 and Georgetown University, Washington, D. C., in 1915 with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He entered the Society of Jesus the same year and served as English and philosophy instructor at Fordham from 1919 to 1923.

He was ordained in 1926 after theological studies at Woodstock and went abroad for special work. In 1930 Fr. Gannon received St. Peter's College, Jersey City, and became its dean. He opened Hudson College of Commerce and Finance and was the first dean, 1933-35. Until his appointment as president of Fordham in June, 1936, he remained St. Peter's dean also.

President Gannon holds degrees from nine colleges and universities and this year received the N. Y. Academy of Public Education award for distinguished service in the field of education.
