# Dr. Adler Lectures At Aquinas Oct. 25

For many years an outstanding champion of the teachings of St. Thomas Aquinas, Dr. Mortimer J. Adler will give the second lecture in the Christian Culture Lecture Series at Aquinas Institute on Sunday evening, Oct. 25, at 8:30 P. M.

Though not a Catholic, Dr. Adler has been an outstanding exponent of the works of the Angelic Doctor. Insisting with his close associate, Robert Maynard Hutchins, president of the University of Chicago, on a new deal in American education, Adler has awakened an interest in the fundamentals of thinking. He has pointed out that nowhere can be seen better the clearly thought-out questions of human living than in the writings of the great saint whose philosophy forms the foundation of Christian thought.

Presently engaged as the professor of the philosophy of law at the University of Chicago, Dr. Adler comes to Rochester, following by two weeks the opening of the lecture series by Monsignor Fulton J. Sheen.

Professor Adler's lecture here is entitled "Geo-politics: The Science Behind This War."

Adler sees a necessity for new thought patterns for the American people. It was customary to regard history and geography as events in time and places in space. We have been given these notions in our schooling.

But Europe now is having a new ideology imposed upon it. Living space must be associated with history rather than with geography. The Nazi mind has convinced itself that because of Germany's history it is its right to extend itself spatially. It is another language expressing a totally differ-

ent way of thinking that one can see in the Europe of today. How can it be understood if we do not learn what that language is and how it is applied?

This is Geo-politics. Adler's treatment of it here in Aquinas auditorium next week is not technical, not abstract.

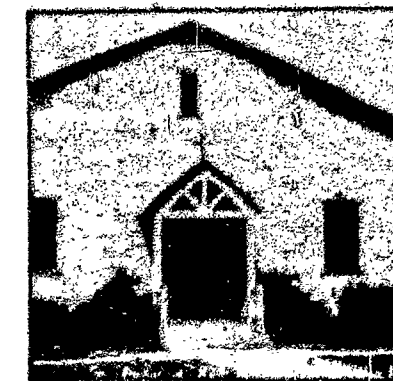

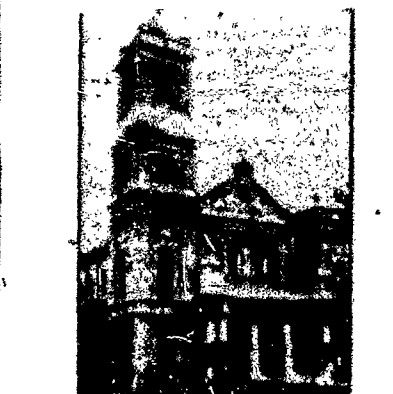

(Private Bernard H. Florack who has written now and then for the CATHOLIC COURIER, is now in the Army stationed at Miami Beach, Florida. This week he sends the account of his experiences printed below.)  
Well! I am now at Miami Beach in a beautiful hotel. The train trip from Fort Niagara was quite an experience. In a way it was educational. Traveling through quite a number of states I have seen things that before I only read about, such as cotton fields, orange groves, Georgia people, etc.

Here at the hotel we have to keep things spotless so spotless that many a soldier will be as good a house-cleaner as his mother. I went swimming in the ocean on Sunday. It's plenty salty. We saw three porpoise fish near shore and they gave us a little scare until we were informed they were not sharks. In our hotel we also have a swimming pool.

The food here is still plenty good. We have to do a lot of things in the dark as lights in the hotel go out at 7:15 P. M. As of yet I haven't seen any rain. The days are hot and nights, cold. For a number of days we went through what is known as processioning. This includes all kinds of exams and finally get classified as to what our duty will be in the air force.

Shortly will be sent to school to become a "radio operator and mechanic."  
There is a rumor that you have to know a lot about a certain job in order to get it. This is false. All you need is ambition and ability to learn.
