

### Rites For Seminarian Held At Mt. Morris

Funeral services for Robert Keating, seminarian of St. Bernard's Seminary were held at St. Patrick's Church in Mt. Morris on Saturday morning, Oct. 17.

Mr. Keating died at St. Mary's Hospital on Thursday, Oct. 15, 1942, after an illness of seven weeks.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was offered by the Rev. William A. Jaffery with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. J. Francis Goggin as Deacon and the Rev. Edward M. Lyons as Sub-deacon.

### Third Order Of St. Francis

The Third Order of St. Francis will meet on Sunday, Oct. 25 at 7:30 P. M. in St. Patrick's Church on Plymouth Ave. North at Brown Street.

Since there is to be a Reception of new members, postulants are asked to be present fifteen minutes earlier and seat themselves in the front pews which other members are requested to leave vacant. Postulants should also bring cards bearing their name, address, parish and the name which they wish to take in the Order.

Henceforth, Receptions will take place in October, and Professions of those who have completed a year's novitiate in November.

It is hoped that many new members will avail themselves, this fall, of the great spiritual advantages of the Third Order. The actual requirements are simple. The Rule prescribes moderation in living; the virtues of temperance and thanksgiving, fasts on the vigils of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and of St. Francis; monthly Confession and Communion; daily recitation of twelve Our Fathers, Hail Marys, and Glorias or of the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin for those who do not say the Divine Office; the timely making of one's will; good example and zeal in the Christian apostolate; the virtue of charity and the spirit of peace; refraining from insolent language, vulgar jokes, or unnecessary oaths; attendance at daily Mass, if possible, and at the monthly meetings—not much more than is expected of any good Catholic.

The rewards, moreover, are exceedingly great and the need even greater for spiritual power. A million followers of St. Francis in the United States would greatly comfort the Holy Father who is himself a Tertiary. Rochester should have at least a thousand.
