FOR BIKE RIDERS. With many boys and girls using their bikes when they go to school now, it is important that the bikes be kept in good condition. It is also important that the bicyclist depend less on the motorist and more on himself for his own safety.

- 1. Inspect and inflate tires. 2. Maintain white light visible for 500 feet at night. 3. Lubricate and adjust fork bearings. 4. Cement handle grips firmly. 5. Have warning device in good order. 6. Adjust and tighten seat. 7. Lubricate wheel bearings, and check brake. 8. Paint fender light color for night driving. 9. Keep reflector and license plate clean. 10. Lubricate chain frequently. 11. Lubricate pedal bearings, and replace worn trends. 12. Adjust and oil sprocket bearings. 13. Tighten wheel nuts and oil bearings. 14. Replace broken spokes.
