Caution Servicemen's Kin Against 'Surprise' Visits

WASHINGTON (NC)—The National Catholic Community Service, with other member groups of the United Service Organizations, is seeking the widest possible circulation of a list of ten cautions for relatives and friends who contemplate visiting men in the armed service.

The cautions were prepared by the National Travelers' Aid Association, one of the USO member groups, in an effort to ward off "surprise visits" which, it was stated, generally lead to "nothing but bitter and expensive disappointments." The list of cautions follows:

"I. Visitors MUST know the name, rank, unit, exact address, and, if possible, the military number of the serviceman they seek.

"II. Advise the serviceman, by registered mail, of your planned visit, and wait for an answer before starting on your trip.

"III. Plans for housing, transportation time of arrival, etc., should be understood by visitor and serviceman before the start of the journey. Arrange for a meeting place.

"IV. Disregard rumors or notices of military or naval units which are the stations of your relatives.

Hitler Aims To Wipe Out Christianity Says Dr. Rauschnig

DETROIT—Adolf Hitler intends to wipe out Christianity after the Jews are annihilated and substitute his new Germanic religion, Dr. Herman Rauschnig, former close confidant of the Fuehrer, said in an address here at the ninth "Christian Culture Series" of the Assumption College League.

According to Rauschnig, Hitler applies with twisted logic philosophy such as Rousseau's back-to-nature idea and advocates that since man is just an animal let him improve biologically like an animal, let a superrace be developed, because "creation is not at an end."

Dr. Rauschnig, the former-president of the former Danzig Senate whom Hitler told of secret aims in an effort to attain his cooperation before Germany overran the Baltic free city along with Poland, listed the seven basic precepts of Nazism as:

- 1—Domination of the whole world, other peoples to be slaves for Germany; 2—A new society of the privileged and the total loss of the rights of the unprivileged; 3—The peasants to become serfs and have merely a function of supplying reserve Nazi blood; 4—A new economic system as a weapon to rule the masses; 5—A new political technique of totalitarianism; 6—A new age based on the biological conception of blood and superrace, and 7—A new religion, free of the fear of death, substituting for the immortality of Christianity other ideas.

Many people in Germany supported the Nazi because of certain good aspects of National Socialism, and they were willing to hope that the concentration camps would pass away as had happened in other revolutions, said Dr. Rauschnig, telling his distinguished audience, which included Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ford, that it was not only a political revolution but a spiritual revolution and a new religion.

The rise of Hitlerism was blamed on "treason of the intellectuals," pragmatism, relativism, scepticism, and cynicism. Americans were warned to eradicate these evils here to bulwark the nation against totalitarianism. Answering questions after his lecture, Dr. Rauschnig said that the only German statesman left who might be a rallying point for decent men was former Premier Bruening, who, he contended, might have halted the rise of Hitler had he not been ousted from influence.
