## FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

AUBURN. The Feast of Christ the King will be celebrated on next Sunday, Oct. 23. This feast is a comparatively new one being instituted at the end of the Holy Year in 1925 by His Holiness, Pope Pius XI. The Pope ordered that it be observed on the last Sunday of October and prescribed on that day that the whole world would renew annually before the Blessed Sacrament exposed its consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

In instituting the Feast of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI said: "The rebellion of individuals and of nations against the authority of Christ has produced deplorable effects—the seeds of discord have been sown far and wide; those bitter enmities and rivalries between nations, which still hinder so much the cause of peace; that insatiable greed which is so often hidden under a pretense of public spirit and patriotism and gives rise to so many private quarrels, a blind and unmoderate selfishness, making men seek nothing but their own comfort and advantage and measure everything by these, no peace in the home, because men have forgotten or neglected their duty; the unity and stability of the family undermined; society, in a word, shaken to its foundations and on its way to ruin."

Thus the Holy Father summed up the condition of the world in 1925 and continued saying: "When we command that Christ our King be venerated by Catholics throughout the world, we are providing for the special needs of our era; a very effective remedy against the pests which pervade human society." In another part he said: "The plague of the age is what is called secularism, with all its attendant errors and impious purposes... the rule of Christ over mankind has been denied. This error went still further, an attempt was made to substitute a certain vague natural religion for the truth of the religion of Christ." In the Gospel of St. John XVIII, Jesus said: "My kingdom is not of this world. Pilate then said to Him: 'Art thou a King then?' and Jesus answered: 'Thou sayest that I am a King. For this was I born and for this came I into the world that I should give testimony to the truth.'"

Today the great Feast of Christ the King is celebrated in a war-torn world, a world which does not believe in prayer. In fact most of the world is opposed to Christ and His Church. When Our Lord came into the world the angels sang: "Peace on earth, good will to men," today Christ is recognized by a little more than thirty per cent of the world, and peace is sought in vain. Christ is the King of Justice and He is the King of Peace. Pope Pius XII is constantly asking for peace, not by arms and bloodshed, but peace through the intercession of the prayers said by his volunteers in the army of prayer.

### SODALITY HOLY HOUR

The Sodality of Mary are conducting a Holy Hour in Honor of Christ the King on Sunday afternoon from 3:30 until 4:30. There will be prayers before the Blessed Sacrament exposed and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. All the parishioners and their friends are invited to participate in this Holy Hour to carry out the purpose of the institution of the Feast, which is to give special homage to Christ as ruler of the world.

### WINS TENNIS LAURELS

Thomas (T. R.) Herbert, son of James B. Herbert of 26 Westlake Ave., is making a name for himself in tennis circles at Notre Dame University. T. R. has reached the finals in the freshman tennis tournament at the Universi-

## Wrap Christmas Gifts For Servicemen

NEW YORK — With only three weeks left in which it is possible to send Christmas gifts to servicemen overseas, the National Catholic Community Service Center, opposite St. Patrick's Cathedral, has announced gift wrapping facilities at the disposal of any persons who wish to send Christmas packages to men overseas.

The Post Office has limited parcels to eleven pounds, but prefer that they be six pounds. Breakables, liquids and food generally are unacceptable, but cigarettes, wrist watches, stationery, prayer books, tiny radios are recommended, it was stated.

A committee of club members of the NCCB is on duty every evening to wrap parcels. The service also is offered to servicemen who wish to send Christmas remembrances.

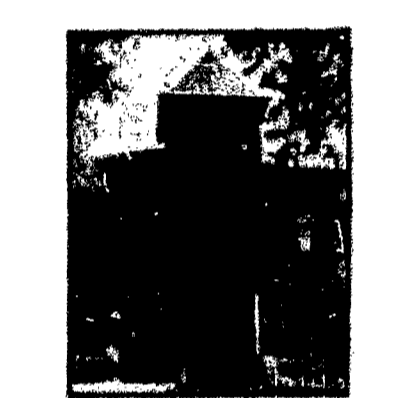
