FEASY OF CHRIST THE KING

AUBURN. The Feast of Christ Sunday Oct 23. This feast is a comparatively new one being instituted at the end of the Holy Year in 1920 by his Holiness, Pope Plus XI. The Pope ordered that it be observed on the last Sunday of October and prescribed on that day annually before the Blessed Sacrament exponed us consecration to the Excred Heart of Jesus.

In instituting the Feast of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI said The rebellion of individuals and of nations against the authority of Christ has produced deployable effects—the seeds of discord have been sown far wid wide those bitfor empities and rivalities between nations, which still bioder so much the cause of veace; that invatiable greed which is so often hidden un-der a pretense of public spirit and patrictium and gives rise to so many private quarrels, a blind and immoderate sellatiness, making men sech nothing but their own comfort and advantage and measure everything by these, no peace in the home, because men have forgotten or neglected their duty: the unity and stability of the fless-ily underminded, society, in a word, shaken to its foundations

and on its way to ruin."
Thus the Holy Father summed up the condition of the world in 1925 and continued saying "When We command that Christ our King be venerated by Catholics throughout the world, we are providing for the special needs of our swit day a very effective remedy against the peats which pervade human so-loty in another part he said. The plague of the age is what is called secularism, with all its at-tendant errors and impious pur-poses. The rule of Christ over mankind has been denied. error went still further, an attempt was made to substitute a certain vague natural religion for the truth of the religion of Christ." In the Gospei of St. John XVIII, Jesus said "My kingdom is not of this world. Pilate then said to Him 'Art thou a King then' and Jasus answered Thou sayest that I am a King. For this was I born and for this came I into the world that I should give testimony to the

Today the great Feast of Christ the King is celebrated in a wartorn world, a world which does not believe in prayer. In fact most of the world is opposed to Christ and His Church. When Our Lord came into the world the angels sang "Peace on earth, good will to mun," today Christ is recognized by a little more than thirty per cent of the world, and peace is sought in vain. Christ is the King of Justice and He is the King of Peace. Pope Plus XII is constantly asking for peace, not by arms and bloodshed, but peace through the intercession of the prayers said by his volumteers in the army of prayer. SODALITY HOLY HOUR
