Complete Course In Journalism

BROOKLYN, N. Y.—The deep faith of a United States Marine private who is a prisoner of the Japanese is revealed in a letter which Mrs. James Barbery, Sr., here has received from her son, James.

The letter is the first she has received from him since he was taken prisoner by the Japanese after the capture of Wake Island. James is one of 11 children.

"Just a few lines to let you know I am, and have been, in the best of health," says the letter, and from a prison camp in Shanghai.

"Do not worry about me, for with the help of God I will be with you all soon again."

"There may be a chance for you to answer this letter. If there is, I would be very glad to hear from you. If you needed papers for your intention, I have all ready in the past months."

Mrs. Barbery attributes her only safety which is prayer, James is a graduate of Holy Names School and Technical High School, Brooklyn. He enlisted in the Marine in November, 1941.
