Many of the peace programs offered thus far have regisered to take into account the primary ap-pect of a true and losting peace, vis. Peace Through Christ It was this aspect engaged the attention of the S7th annual convention of the Catholic Contral Versin of America, held recently to St Louis A resolution on this subject conaiders both the causes of the present struggle and the one was to schiove the peace for which all sten long. The text states

Thinking men are directing their thoughts even in the midst of utrite and carnage, to the peace that is to follow the war They realise that without definite peace aims the war may be drawn out for years to come. Furthermore civilization itself stands in great danger of collapsing if, after the war the fleresst and most widespread of all time a lasting peace is not secured. The blood now being shed, the lives lost, the destruction now being wrought __ all will have been in vain if a just and permanent peace does not result from this terrible struggle.

We associate curielyon, therefore, with the thoughtful men and women at our action in turning to the problem of arranging a peace which will satisfy the hopes and desires of men everywhere With our President we adopt the stand that the peace for which we have taken up arms shall not be a peace of conquest or venguance. A peace such as that cannot en-dure. In this connection we recall the words of our Sovereign Pon-tiff: The sword cannot breed peace, it can only impose peace."
Each day the evidence becomes

clearer that the loss of religion is the prime cause of the loss of peace in the world. Religion is the bedruck foundation for all human relationables, on which true peace must be built. It teaches in plain words which all may comprchere, that man is more than an animal Made according to the image of God and held to be a child of God, mun is invested with a high dig-nity Because of this he has rights and treedoms that set him above brute creation. Before these rights and freedoms selfishness and lust for power fortile sources of discord, strife and war must make halt.

The paganism of old despite its rich contributions to human cul ture had no sense of the value of the human personality Hence it curdoned slavery and giorified war. Neopaganism likewise has no concept of real human values And so men are again in slavery imposed by dominating and dictatorial gov-ernments, and war rages on five vast continents. But instead of a pagan outlook on human life there must be shown once more the view of man as he is in the light of Christian teachings.

In other words, the teachings of Christ must once again exercise their influence over men a thoughts and actions Moral principles must be given their proper place in ho man relationships. Justice and charity must infuse a new spirit of vigor into the law of mationa the only sale basis of agreements. covenants or treaties among nations If economic security is to be obtained, private property espec-ally family-sized farms and rural homesteads, must be promoted and safemarded. Industrial balance must be promoted by adjusting the relations between capital and labor on a basis of a frank and mutual recognition of rights and duties. Free enterprise must be shielded against governmental regi mentation and dominion. Freedoms must be preserved and expanded, but within the limits of social responsibilities, exercised largely through organizations of a corporative nature, such as Pope Pius XI advocates, these associaons must be constituted on democratic basis for self-governing, collective and responsible ac-

To such fundamental ideas we direct the attention of our mem-bers and urge the serious study and discussion of them, so that a true and lasting peace may be established and prevail in a new order which thinking men are seeking to bring about in both domestic and ferrige affairs.
