## PHOTO MARINE FINDS IN SOLOMONS RECALLS ST. BERNARD'S SEMINARY

Even in the Solomons a worthy work of Catholic Action can become known, it is revealed in a letter to the Rev. Dr. Wilfred Craugh of St. Bernard's Seminary from a U. S. Marine stationed in the islands, a former seminarian at St. Bernard's.

It was the photograph of the Rev. Dr. John A. Reddington, faculty moderator, and two assistants, William H. 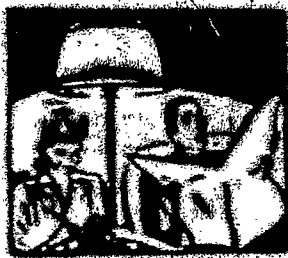


