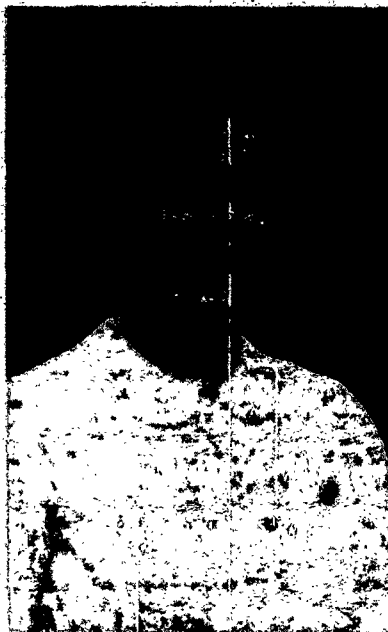

Nun Who Founded Hospital In West Is Mourned Here

Rev. Mother M. Bonaventura Groh, O.P., died on Wednesday, Sept. 23, 1942, at St. Joseph's Hospital in Chewelah, Washington, friends in Rochester are informed. This hospital was founded by Mother Bonaventura in August, 1935, when she arrived in this country from Germany.

Mother M. Bonaventura was head of a small group of Dominican Sisters who came to St. Charles College now Carroll College — in Helena, Montana. As the Community expanded, Mother Bonaventura and some of the Sisters moved in 1930 to Washington to build St. Joseph's Hospital in Chewelah.

For four years after coming to Chewelah, the Sisters resided at St. Mary's of the Pines, and from there removed to the Lady of the Valley Convent, Kettle Falls. Eighty Sisters in the ten houses of the community mourn the death of their foundress.

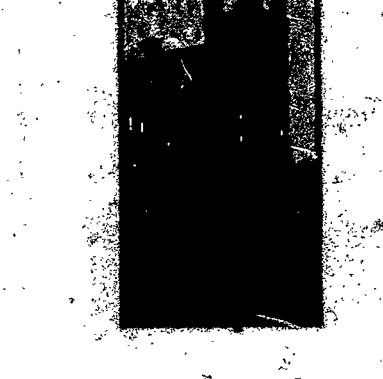
