tice Day, this year, he was elevated to the Episcopacy on Oct. 28, 1837 in St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York The day is memorable to Bishop Kearney because it is also his own birthday and that of his mother's.

The consecrator was the late Patrick Cardinal Hayes, Arch-bishop of New York, long a friend of the newly created Bishop and one fully aware of the nutstanding record as éducator and pastor had been made by him

Consecrated for the Bee of Salt Lake City, Bishop Kearney took up his work in that mission area where the territory to be traversed and the difficulties presented were many. There were but 33 priests to carry on the work in

Zealous, understanding and dynamic in leadership the Bishop of Sair Lake won and still retains the loyal cooperation of his fack there Through his efforts despite meager resources in the wastern diocese, Bishop Kearney paid off the debt on the Cathedral of the Madeline in Salt Lake City and
