MILWAUKEE—The bulk of the estate of the late Mrs. Lena Heidl, of Milwaukee, has been willed to three Catholic groups.

Urges Canadians To Wartime Self Denial

MONTREAL — An honor roll containing the names of 400 men of the parish who are serving in every branch of the Canadian and British armies was dedicated at St. Anthony's Church here by the Most Rev. C. L. Nelligan, Bishop of Pembroke and Principal Catholic Chaplain of the Canadian Armed Forces.

Bishop Nelligan made a stirring appeal to all men and women to exert every possible effort in the realm of Christian endeavor for Canada's war effort. The whole fabric of Christian civilization is imperilled, he declared, saying: "There are many things vital to the war effort to which many unfit for active service can contribute. The success of the third Victory Loan is of paramount importance in the war effort, towards which every man and woman should subscribe as much as possible."

There is a need for greater sacrifices and self denial of luxuries that more comforts might be supplied to the armed forces, he declared, adding that there is also need for a whole-hearted patriotism. He said the British Empire, where Canadians had enjoyed such a large measure of religious freedom, needs every support that the fight may be successful against the forces which would destroy religion.
