AUBURN-Monsignor Fulton J. Sheen, America's outstanding author, teacher and orator, opened the Lecture Series sponsored by the Catholic Women's Club of Syracuse

on Sunday evening when he addressed a capacity audience of 2500 people in Central High School Auditorium in Syracuse. Monsignor Sheen was introduced by Monsignor Cunningham, moderator of the Catholic Women's Club.

In opening his address the Monsignor said. People are to much concerned with the means of life and have forgotten that it is the end of life which is the important point to be considered. We will not have peace by defeating Hitler. We will have peace when we change the mode of living that has produced a Hitler. The question to ask ourselves today is What kind of ideas will prevail in the new world? and the second question to be considered is How many
