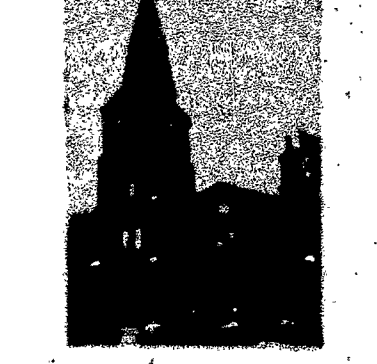

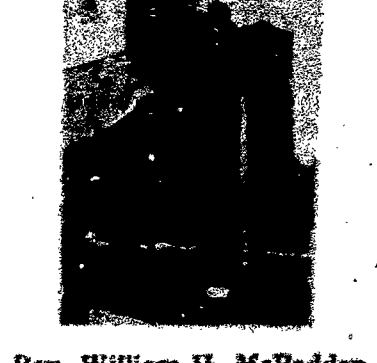

Conversions Grow In India

MADRAS, India.—In a signed article published here in the New Leader, the Most Rev. Thomas Pothakamury, Bishop of Guntur, writes that "the prejudice against Christianity and its messengers (the clergy) is gradually being dispated" and that "the prospects of the future are hopeful" in India.

"Though we have had many group conversions," he says of his diocese, "we met with no difficulties except in one caste village where relatives of the catechumens tried hard to dissuade them from accepting the new faith.

"We have had many proofs of the good will of Hindus towards us, both in Guntur, a city of 21,000, and in the villages, where Hindus have welcomed me along with the Catholics." His Excellency adds, "My priests and myself have been invited to Hindu social functions, including tea parties and dinners in orthodox Hindu homes, and al-

ways are given the place of honor. On three occasions I have been invited to preside over public meetings, and just as I was writing this article three members of the Guntur municipality told me that the Council in its (last) meeting . . . resolved to ask me to preside over the Council's Day celebrations . . . and requested me to accept the invitation."

These actions are all indications that the antipathy toward the Church is on the wane, he concludes.

The funeral of Edward J. Broderick, 78, well-known local business man whose death occurred on Sunday at his home was held on Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock from his home, 32 North Genesee Street, and at 10 o'clock from St. Francis de Sales Church. Interment was in St. Patrick's Cemetery.

Mr. Broderick is survived by his wife, Bridget; one daughter, Mrs. J. Elliott Cooney; one son, E. J. Broderick, Jr., of LeRoy, N. Y.; three grandchildren; and one sister, Mrs. J. W. White, of Geneva.

He was born in Geneva on Dec. 12, 1865, son of William and Hannah Rogan Broderick. His education was received in the Geneva public schools and St. Francis de Sales School. When 17 years of age, he left school and learned the machinist's trade, working for the Standard Optical Company for six years. In 1892, he opened a men's furnishing store at 23 Seneca St., in 1895, where he was located at the time of his death.

He was married in 1886 to Bridget Kane of Geneva. Mr. Broderick was a member of the Democratic

man of the party for many years and tax collector of Geneva for one year. He was a member of St. Francis de Sales Church and was local overseer of the poor for twenty years. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus, P. P. O. E., Chamber of Commerce, Merchants' Association and Lakeside Country Club.
