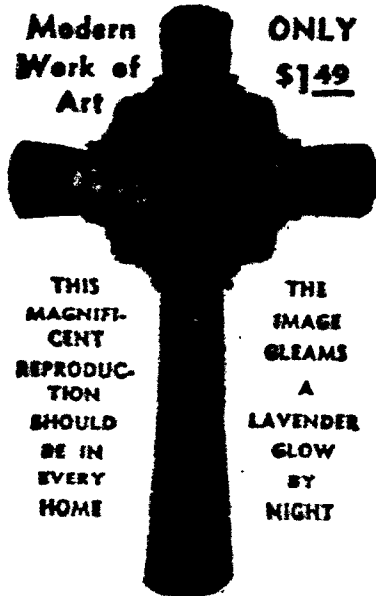

Latest Nazi Tactics Exposed By Culture Lecturer At Windsor

WINDSOR, Ont. — Attacks on the British war effort, charges that the federal government is becoming totalitarian, and apologies for the German people, are the latest forms of Nazi propaganda rampant in the U. S. A., declared Dr. Francis E. McMahon, professor of Philosophy at the University of Notre Dame, in an address Sunday night, Nov. 1, under the auspices of the Assumption College Lecture League in the "Christian Culture Series" at the Vanity Theatre, Windsor, before a large international audience of Canadians and Americans.

The Nazis work ceaselessly to divide the allies. Right now they are trying to make the world forget the sublime fight that the British Empire put up for two years against the criminal gangs of Europe. England has committed blunders, but so have we of the U. S. A. If England failed at Singapore, we failed at Pearl Harbor. This is not the time for the pot to be calling the kettle black. As a matter of fact, both allies are doing their best, and what mistakes have been made are the result of the isolationistic mentality which weighed so heavily upon the democracies of the last twenty years.

Dr. McMahon characterized "Life's" Open Letter to Britain as the "most flagrant example of irresponsible journalism in recent years."

Stab In Back

Furthermore, he stated "The Nazi dupes in the U. S. A. are also claiming that we have abandoned the democratic way of life and have turned to totalitarianism. Professor Sorokin of Harvard has said in his latest book that this is not a war between totalitarianism and democracy, but between two totalitarianisms. Dr. Sorokin's book is a psychological stab in the back. The very fact that he can publish freely such a work in these critical times shows that we have not too little democracy, but perhaps too much."

The third current attack of the Nazis today is to weaken our will to fight by stressing the inherent perfection of the German people. There are men in the U. S. A. now maintaining that the German people are all right only if we could get rid of a few hundred of their present leaders. It is wrong to hate the German people, but realism demands us to recognize that the Germans have shown little capacity for democratic government thus far. They are people easily led by criminal dictators. We must be just to the Germans, but justice demands education for an unstable people. I hope some day the Germans can be democratic. But democracy is a thing one gradually grows unto." Dr. McMahon is President of the Catholic Association For International Peace and stressed the necessity of winning the peace the tranquility of order — order based on justice, charity, freedom GOD
