Bishop Cushing Receives Young Women Into Carmel

In the presence of friends and relatives, Miss Gertrude Stanton of Boston, Massachusetts was received into the Carmelite Order in a simple and impressive ceremony on Thursday Oct. 29, at the Carmelite Monastery on East Ave.

The Most Rev. Richard Cushing, D.D., Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Boston, officiated. He was assisted by the Rev. John S. Randall, Chaplain of the Monastery, and Miss Stanton's brother, the Rev. Mr. Edward Stanton of the Society of Jesus.

In the sanctuary were the Rev. Edward Ryan of West Roxbury, Mass., the Rev. Father Thomas of the Carmelite Novitiate in Boston, the Rev. Arthur Donnelly, C.S.S.R., of Boston, Mass., the Rev. James F. Kelly of Jamaica Plain, New York, the Rev. John McEleney, S.J., of Fairfield, Mass., and the Rev. Richard Walsh of Brooklyn, N. Y., the Rev. Leo C. Mooney, Rev. Maynard Connell and Rev. Leo V. Smith, all of Rochester.

Attending also were Miss Stanton's parents, Dr. and Mrs. Joseph Stanton, and her brothers and sisters, Richard, Clair Joseph, Ann, Louise and Vincent Stanton. Another sister is a Carmelite nun in Boston.

Confers Habit

A Low Mass was offered at 9 o'clock by Bishop Cushing. Following the Mass the Bishop approached the candidate to receive her formal request to be admitted into the Order. He then blessed and conferred the brown habit of Carmel and gave her the name by which she will be known in religion, Sister Ann of the Trinity.

In preaching the sermon for the occasion, Bishop Cushing said that in truth no words of his were necessary. Miss Stanton in her life and particularly in the ceremony of the day had preached the most eloquent of sermons. Taking the Gospel story of Jesus at the home of Martha and Mary, Bishop Cushing showed the perfect complement of the active and contemplative life in the character of each, stressing that both were necessary in the perfect worship of God.

Mary is taken as the example of the contemplative. Bishop Cushing said that "every Carmelite is another Mary. In her the spiritual life is lived in its essence. Her every prayer and act is a further union with God. Just as the hawk flying higher and higher in the blue sings its sweetest songs at heaven's gate, so the Carmelite mounts in her upward path closer and closer to God until it can be said that only the veil of the Carmelite separates her from God."
