

## MEDAL TO HONOR WILLKIE FOR INTER FAITH EFFORTS

NEW YORK Wendell L. Willkie Republican nominee for President in 1940, has been declared, by a committee of 65 eminent Americans of the three faiths the 1942 American Hebrew Medal recipient for the promotion of better understanding between Christian and Jew in America.

This announcement was issued by Joseph H. Eiben, editor and publisher of the American Hebrew. Mr. Eiben is a resident of Rochester where he is also publisher of The Jewish Ledger.

The presentation of the medal in December will be a recognition of Wendell L. Willkie's contribution to the services of his country in this day of grave national crisis, and particularly for his continuous contribution to the cause of oppressed minorities. Mr. Eiben said.


