Former Scranton Chancellor Dies

SCRANTON, Pa.—The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William P. Kealy, former Chancellor of the Diocese of Scranton, died Wednesday at the age of 54, the day after he celebrated the twenty-ninth anniversary of his ordination.

Monsignor Kealy, Pastor of St. Patrick's Church since 1930, served as Chancellor from 1923 to 1930. Born in Limerick, Pa., he was educated at St. Thomas College here and the North American College in Rome. He was ordained at the German College in Rome and a year later became Professor of Latin at the University of Scranton when it was St. Thomas College. He was elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate by Pope Pius XI in 1928.
