NEW ORLEANS. Fascist leaders of Italy have allied themselves "with the devil himself," the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles P. Greco, Pastor of St. Maurice Church, said at St. Mary's Italian Church on the occasion of a Mass for deceased members of the parish. "With their false philosophy the Nazis have crushed Europe, including Catholic Italy," he said. "They seek to shackle all liberty-loving peoples and to force them to follow their anti-God principles in their attempt to control the world."
